

SO versus TOO

These two sentences have almost the same meaning. The grammar pattern is different.

I am so tired that I can't move. I am too tired to move.

Here are more examples.

This coffee is so hot that I can't drink it. This coffee is too hot (for me) to drink.

The suitcase was so heavy that I couldn't lift it. The suitcase was too heavy (for me) to lift.

2. It is so dark in here that I can't see.

3. This music is so loud that we can't talk. ("for us")

B. Change the following sentences to the "so" pattern.

1. I was too excited to sleep.
