Model:

Sheila exercises as much as Jim.

Explanation:

When two things or two people are similar in a certain aspect, the expressions as...as are used. This is how they would be placed in a sentence:

Noun + verb + as + adjective + as + Noun

Example: Sheila is as tall as Jim.

Noun + verb + as + adverb + as + Noun

Example: Sheila runs as fast as Jim.

These sentences can also be used in the negative by placing the word "not" after the verb "to be" or using "don't/doesn't" before other verbs.

Noun + to be + not + as + adjective + as + Noun

Example: Sheila is not as heavy as Jim.

Noun + do/does + not + verb + as + adjective + as + Noun

Example: Sheila does not exercise as much as Jim.
